

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

RES. NO. 1-73

WHEREAS, Alcoholism and severe drinking are major problems among the Papago people and do severely disrupt family and community life:

WHEREAS, There is a need for an effective rehabilitation facility located on the reservation for Papago people:

WHEREAS, There is presently no local facility for long range rehabilitation of Papago Alcoholics:

WHEREAS, There is an organized and funded Papago Alcoholism Prevention Program which could organize and administer such a facility in conjunction with the Papago Executive Health Staff:

WHEREAS, The Papago Council recognizes this need and desires to see such a facility established on the Reservation for the good of all of the people;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

The Papago Council supports the establishment of an alcoholic rehabilitation facility of the type generally known as a Alcoholic Halfway House.

The Papago Council directs the director and staff of the Papago Alcoholism Prevention Program and the Papago Executive Health Staff to investigate the resources needed to establish such a rehabilitation facility.


The Papago Council authorizes the Chairman, the Alcoholism Prevention Program and the Executive Health Staff to call upon all necessary tribal resources to support the establishment of such a facility and to investigate and negotiate for outside resources needed.

The Papago Council calls upon all the Papago People, districts and communities to support the Chairman and the Alcoholism Prevention Program staff and Director in this effort to meet the needs of our Papago people.


The foregoing resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on January 19, 1973 at a meeting of which a quorum was present by a vote of 14 for and 3 against 6 absent.


