

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

RES. NO. 23-73

WHEREAS, Alcoholism is one of the more urgent and pressing problems on the Papago Reservation and in the country as a whole; and

WHEREAS, The Papago Tribal Council feels that a vigorous and positive program must be undertaken to meet this community problem,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Tribal Accounting Department be directed and authorized to investigate the desirability of securing a housetrailer for the establishment of a positive Alcoholism Program;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Tribal Treasurer be authorized to obligate the Tribe for the purchase of an appropriately designed trailer of adequate size to house the Program office staff.

The foregoing resolution was duly enacted by The Papago Council on the twenty-fourth day of April 1973, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of sixteen for, one against, two not voting and three absent, pursuant to authority vested in the Papago Council by Sections 3 (a), 2 (e), of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona, ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934. Said resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency and is subject to review by the Secretary of the Interior.
