

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

RES. NO. 38-73

WHEREAS, The Papago Tribe has undertaken the development of some of the natural resources on the Reservation to provide job opportunities to Papagos; and

WHEREAS, There are now employment opportunities available to trained Papagos in the mines on Reservation and near the Reservation, and

WHEREAS, There is a large percentage of unemployment among working age Papagos on the Reservation, due in part to lack of training in the mining skills, and

WHEREAS, The leadership of the Tribe has been working with the Bureau of Mines, Department of Labor, and HEW for a period of two years to establish a mining training program on Reservation,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Papago Council approves and authorizes the establishment of the Papago Mining Institute to provide Adult Basic Education classes and training in both open pit and underground mining skills as provided in the two attached documents.

The foregoing resolution was duly enacted by The Papago Council on the sixth day of July, 1973, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of nineteen for, zero against, zero not voting, and three absent, pursuant to authority vested in the Papago Council by Sections 2 (a) (d) (h), 3 (a) of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona, ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934. Said resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency and is subject to review by the Secretary of the interior.
