## RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

RES. NO. 51-73

WHEREAS, The Papago Tribe does not have a General Counsel at this time; and

WHEREAS, A Council Committee is engaged in preparing certain proposed changes and/or amendments to the Papago Tribal Constitution and By-Laws; and

WHEREAS, The Council has need of legal advice in the preparation of these changes and amendments,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT, the Papago Agency Superintendent be officially requested to secure the services of a Bureau of Indian Affairs attorney on a temporary basis and at no cost to the Tribe to aid in drafting the required amendments; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT, the Agency Superintendent request the specific assignment to Mr. Calvin Brice of the Bureau of Indian Affairs, Washington. Office, to assist the Council and its committees in this task.

The foregoing resolution was duly enacted by The Papago Council on the <u>third</u> day of <u>August</u> 1973, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of <u>sixteen</u> for, <u>zero</u> against, <u>zero</u> not voting, and <u>six</u> absent, pursuant to authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (b), Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona, ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934. Said resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency and is subject to review by the Secretary of the Interior.
