RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

RES. NO. 421-74

WHEREAS; the health and success of the Papago Livestock Industry is dependent upon a centralized livestock assembly point, and

WHEREAS; this assembly point (complex) is needed to provide facilities to classify, market and otherwise handle and dispose of cattle and horses for all Papago livestock owners, and

WHEREAS; a cafe, permanent water supply is essential to provide water for said livestock and the complex area on a continous basis, and

WHEREAS; all the necessary pens, scales, auction area, chutes and other livestock handling facilities combined as a livestock complex has been planned and authorized for the Papago Tribe.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Papago Council hereby authorizes the Tribal Chairman to negotiate with the Bureau of Indian Affairs to contract for the development of one 12" diameter water well located in Section 14 T17S R3E.

The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Tribal Council on the 26th day of September, 1974 at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 18 for, 0 against, 3 not voting and 1 absent, pursuant to the authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2(d) of Article V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937 (48 Stat. 984) pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934. Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency and is not subject to review by the Secretary of the Interior.
