

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

RES. NO. 61-74

WHEREAS, alcoholism and severe drinking are major problems among the Papago people and do severely disrupt family community life; and

WHEREAS, recognizing the need for an alcoholism rehabilitation program, the Papago Council, by Resolution No. 1-73, did authorize the Chairman of the Alcoholism Prevention Program and the Executive Health Staff to call upon tribal resources to support the establishment of an alcoholism rehabilitation facility; and

WHEREAS, in conformity with said Resolution, the Papago Halfway House program was established; and

WHEREAS, the Papago Halfway House program requires funding for the period starting September 1, 1974 and ending June 30, 1975.


NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that Jacob A. Escalante, Chairman of the Papago Tribe, is hereby authorized and directed to sign, on behalf of the Tribe, a contract with the B.I.A. to provide personnel, materials equipment, facilities and services to operate the Papago Halfway House on the Papago Reservation.


The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 18 day of December, 1974, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 18 for; 0 against; 2 not voting; and 2 absent; pursuant to authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (e) and (f) of Article V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934. Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency and is not subject to review by the Secretary of the Interior.
