RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

RES. NO. 6-74

WHEREAS, the Bureau of Indian Affairs has in the past taken on the assignment of drilling and rehabilitating water wells on the Papago Reservation, and

WHEREAS, the Papago Tribe wishes to take on the responsibility for the Reservation well drilling and rehabilitation program for the fiscal year 1974;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribal Chairman is hereby authorized to enter into a contract with the Bureau of Indian Affairs in which the Bureau of Indian Affairs will pay the Tribe \$135,000.00 and the Tribe will provide all labor, including supervisory personnel, and materials necessary to drill four (4) new wells (estimated cost \$80,000.00) and to rehabilitate eleven (11) existing wells (estimated cost \$55,000.00).

The foregoing resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on February 1, 1974, at a meeting of which a quorum was present by a vote of 20 for, 0 against and 2 absent, pursuant to the authority vested in the Council by Section 2(A) Article V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe as amended, ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937 (Stat. 984), pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934.
