RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

RES. NO. 19-75

1 WHEREAS, Cor-Pac Industries is interested in establishing an industry on the
2 Papago Industrial Park and/or the Papago Reservation for the manufact-
3 uring of many products from waste paper; and

4 WHEREAS, funds could possibly be made available through governmental agencies,
5 such as Environmental Protection Agency, for the development of such
6 an industry; and

7 WHEREAS, the Papago Tribe would like to explore the possibility of acquiring
8 grants or other means of funding such a project with the Papago Tribe
9 owning at least 51% of such industry; and

10 WHEREAS, Cor-Pac Industries is willing to take the initial steps in exploring
11 and developing the ways and means by acquiring the necessary funding.

12 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Papago Council hereby expresses its
13 sincere interest in establishing an industry for the manufacturing
14 of many products from waste paper on the Papago Reservation and/or
15 on the Papago Industrial Park, and authorizes that steps be taken to
16 explore the possibility of acquiring the necessary funding from the
17 governmental agencies and/or other sources to establish such an
18 industry.

19 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that any grants or funding that might become available
20 and all proposed contracts involving such an industry must be for-
21 mally approved by the Papago Council and prior to acceptance of any
22 fund or execution of any contract.

23 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 14 day
24 of April, 1975, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 21
25 for, 0 against, and 1 absent, pursuant to the authority vested in the Papago
26 Council by Section 2(a), Section 3(g) (h) of Article V of the Constitution and
27 By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona ratified by the Papago Tribe on December
28 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937 (48
29 Stat: 984) pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934. Said Resolution
30 is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the
31 Papago Agency and is subject to review by the Secretary of the Interior.
