

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

RES. NO. 24-75

1 WHEREAS, the number of marijuana possession and other dangerous
2 drugs has greatly increased over the past two years; and
3 WHEREAS, Ordinance 46 which bans the sale or possession of var-
4 ious dangerous drugs is being enforced by the Tribal
5 and B.I.A. Police; and
6 WHEREAS, it is impossible to prove violation of Ordinance 46
7 without the use of laboratory chemicals analysis and
8 testimony by experts the cases would have to be thrown
9 out; and
10 WHEREAS, the cost of these tests has not been included in the
11 Police budgets, thus making it impossible for prosecu-
12 tion of violation of Ordinance 46; and
13 WHEREAS, it is important to the health and safety of the Papago
14 Tribe that the use of these dangerous drugs be curtail-
15 ed by enforcing the present laws.
16 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Papago Tribal Court's
17 budget be increased by the amount of FIVE HUNDRED DOL-
18 LARS (\$500.00) to pay for the chemical tests and expert
19 opinions.

20 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on
21 the 2nd day of May, 1975, by a vote of 20 for, 0 against, 1 not
22 voting and 1 absent, in a meeting at which a quorum was present,
23 pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 2(h) and
24 Section 3(b) of the Constitution, as amended, of the Papago Tribe
25 ratified on December 12, 1936 and approved by the Secretary of the
Interior on January 6, 1937 (48 Stat: 984) pursuant to Section 16
of the Act of June 18, 1934. Said Resolution is effective as of
the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago
Agency and is subject to review by the Secretary of the Interior.
