NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Papago Tribal Court's 16 budget be increased by the amount of FIVE HUNDRED DOL-17 LARS (\$500.00) to pay for the chemical tests and expert 18 19 opinions. The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on 20 the 2nd day of May, 1975, by a vote of 20 for, 0 against, 1 not voting and 1 absent, in a meeting at which a quorum was present, 21 pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 2(h) and Section 3(b) of the Constitution, as amended, of the Papago Tribe ratified on December 12, 1936 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937 (48 Stat: 984) pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934.
