RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

RES. NO. 37-75b

1 WHEREAS, the Papago Tribe, the Papago Tribal Council and the Papa-
2 go Education Committee are disturbed and concerned with the esta-
3 blishment of the Bureau of Indian Affairs permanent personnel
4 ceiling which required a severe reduction of permanent Bureau posi-
5 tions in this area that will critically affect the education pro-
6 gram of the Papago Tribe; and

7 WHEREAS, unless the Bureau personnel ceilings are increased suf-
8 ficiently to enable the hiring of sixty-six (66) additional teach-
9 ers and staff members for Santa Rosa Boarding School and thirty-
10 five (35) new teachers and staff members for the newly constructed
11 San Simon School, the new addition to Santa Rosa Boarding School and
12 the new San Simon school will not be operational this coming 1975-
13 76 school term; and

14 WHEREAS, to enable the proper hiring of qualified teachers and
15 staff the Bureau personnel ceiling must be raised immediately so
16 that the Bureau will be able to compete with the State of Arizona's
17 hiring of teachers for schools in the State of Arizona; and

18 WHEREAS, unless this is accomplished many Papago students will
19 not receive an adequate basic education that was promised to them
20 by the United States Congress; and

21 WHEREAS, when Congress allocated funds for the new addition to
22 Santa Rosa Boarding School and for the construction of the new
23 San Simon School it was clearly their intention that the proper
24 teachers and staff members would be available when these schools
25 were completed.

26 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Papago Council hereby
27 authorizes the Chairman of the Papago Tribe and all other necessary
28 personnel selected by him to take whatever steps are necessary to
29 accomplish the necessary changes in the Bureau of Indian Affairs
30 permanent personnel ceiling policy so that the necessary teachers
31 and staff can be hired at the earliest possible moment in order
32 that the new additions to Santa Rosa Boarding School and the newly

1 constructed San Simon School will be operational for the 1975-76
2 school year.

3 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on
4 the 13th day of June, 1975, at a meeting at which a quorum was pre-
5 sent with a vote of 22 for, 0 against, 0 not voting and 0 absent;
6 pursuant to authority vested in the Papago Council by Sec. 2 (a)
7 (d) of Article V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago
8 Tribe of Arizona ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and
9 approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937 (48
10 Stat: 984) pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934.
11 Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the
12 Superintendent of the Papago Agency and is not subject to review
13 by the Secretary of the Interior.
