## RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

1 WHEREAS, the Papago Tribe, the Papago Tribal Council and the Papa-2 go Education Committee are disturbed and concerned with the esta-3 blishment of the Bureau of Indian Affair's permanent personnel 4 ceiling which required a severe reduction of permanent Bureau posi-5 tions in this area that will critically affect the education pro-6 gram of the Papago Tribe; and

7 WHEREAS, unless the Bureau personnel ceilings are increased suf8 ficiently to enable the hiring of sixty-six (66) additional teac9 here and staff members for Santa Rosa Boarding School and thirty10 five (35) new teachers and staff members for the newly constructed
11 San Simon School, the new addition to Santa Rosa Boarding School and
12 the new San Simon school will not be operational this coming 197513 76 school term; and

14 WHEREAS, to enable the proper hiring of qualified teachers and 15 staff the Bureau personnel ceiling must be raised immediately so 16 that the Bureau will be able to compete with the State of Arizona's 17 hiring of teachers for schools in the State of Arizona; and 18 WHEREAS, unless this is accomplished many Papago students will 19 not receive an adequate basic education that was promised to them 20 by the United States Congress; and

WHEREAS, when Congress allocated funds for the new addition to Santa Rosa Boarding School and for the construction of the new San Simon School it was clearly their intention that the proper teachers and staff members would be available when these schools were completed.

NOW, THEREFREE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Papago Council hereby authorizes the Chairman of the Papago Trieb and all other necessary personnel selected by him to take whatever steps are necessary to accomplish the necessary changes in the Bureau of Indian Affairs permanent personnel ceiling policy so that the necessary teachers and staff can be hired at the earliest possible moment in order that the new additions to Santa Rosa Boarding School and the newly 1 constructed San Simon School will be operational for the 1975-76

3 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 13th day of June, 1975, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 22 for, 0 ggainst, 0 not voting and 0 absent; pursuant to authority vested in the Papago Council by Sec. 2 (a) 5 (d) of Article V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937 (48 Stat: 984) pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934. 7 Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency and is not subject to review by the Secretary of the Interior.
