

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

RES. NO. 38-75

1 WHEREAS, the goals of the Papago Tribe are for self-sufficiency  
2 and self-determination; and

3 WHEREAS, the Papago Tribe needs skilled department heads, program  
4 managers and professional staff and desires these positions be  
5 be filled with Tribal members; and

6 WHEREAS, Papagos with these abilities and education are employed  
7 elsewhere because of more favorable wages and employment conditions;  
8 and


9 WHEREAS, it is necessary to evaluate and assess the present over-  
10 all personnel management system of the Tribe to determine how it  
11 may be improved; and

12 WHEREAS, the Civil Service Commission has, under the authority of  
13 the Inter-governmental Personnel Act of 1970, the power to make  
14 grants for the improvement of governmental personnel systems.

15 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Papago Council hereby re-  
16 quests financial assistance from the U.S. Civil Service Commission  
17 under the provision of the IPA for grant to aid the Tribe in im-  
18 proving its personnel system and employment conditions.

19 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on  
20 June 17, 1975 at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a  
21 vote of 20 for, 0 against, 0 not voting and 2 absent, pursuant to  
22 authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2(d) of Article  
23 V of the Constitution of the Papago Tribe of Arizona, ratified by  
24 the Tribe on December 12, 1936 and approved by the Secretary of  
the Interior on January 6, 1937((48 Stat. 984) pursuant to Section  
16 of the Act of June 18, 1934. Said Resolution is effective as of  
the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency  
and is not subject to review by the Secretary of the Interior.
