

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

RES. NO. 45-75

1 WHEREAS, The Commodity Food Distribution Program nationally is
2 scheduled to end on June 30, 1977, and

3 WHEREAS, the Food Distribution Program continues to benefit many
4 Papago people who would not be financially able to partic-
5 ipate in the Arizona Food Stamp Program; and

6 WHEREAS, both the Food Stamp and the Food Distribution Programs
7 are important to the health and nutrition of the Papago
8 people; and

9 WHEREAS, the participation rates in both programs justify their
10 continuation;

11 NOW, THEREFOER, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that:

12 1. They do request the U.S. Congress to authorize the
13 continuation after June, 1977 of both the Food Distribu-
14 tion and the Food Stamp programs, priveded that any one
15 household may receive assistance from only one program.

16 2. They do authorize the Chairman and his delegates to
17 initiate efforts to assure the continuation of both programs.

18 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on
19 the 23rd day of July, 1975, at a meeting at which a quorum was
20 present with a vote of 834.0 for, 0 against, 0 not voting,
21 and 0 absent; pursuant to authority vested in the Papago Council
22 by Section 2(d) of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the
23 Papago Tribe of Arizona ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936
24 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937,
25 pursuant to Section 12 of the Act of June 18, 1934. Said Resolution
26 is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent
27 of the Papago Agency and is not subject to review by the Secretary
28 of the Interior.
