

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

RECEIVED AUG 05 1975

RES. NO. 46-75

1 WHEREAS, the present income guidelines for eligibility to partic-
2 ipate in the Papago Food Distribution Program correspond
3 to the exceptionally low Arizona Welfare Standards; and

4 WHEREAS, these basic standards date to 1968 and have not been
5 adequately adjusted for the increase in living cost during
6 the past 7 years; and do exclude many families who used
7 food assistance but cannot afford Food Stamps; and

8 WHEREAS, adjustments upward from State Welfare Standards and/or
9 other special eligibility criteria have been made for
10 several other tribes (Nez Perce, Navajo, Nevada).

11 NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that:

12 1. They do request that the U.S. Department of Agriculture,
13 Food & Nutrition Service Authorize a Higher income
14 eligibility criteria at Papago;

15 2. Do authorize the Chairman and his delegates to negotiate
16 with USDA to establish a criteria in reasonable accord
17 with the needs of the people.

18 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on
19 the 23rd day of July, 1975, at a meeting at which a quorum was
20 present with a vote of 834.0 for, 0 against, 0 not voting and
21 0 absent; pursuant to authority vested in the Papago Council by
22 Section 2(d) of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the
23 Papago Tribe of Arizona ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936
24 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937,
25 pursuant to Section 12 of the Act of June 18, 1934. Said Resolution
26 is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent
27 of the Papago Agency and is not subject to review by the Secretary
28 of the Interior.
