

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

RECEIVED AUG 05 1975

RES. NO. 50-75

1 WHEREAS, there are servere housing problems on the Papago Reservation
2 as demonstrated by more than 800 applications for assistance
3 on file at Papago Housing and Papago CD; and

4 WHEREAS, existing HUD and HIP contract programs can not meet the
5 need for new housing for many years; and

6 WHEREAS, many of our people are willing to build their own houses
7 with TWEPE assistance but require financial assistance to
8 purchase roofing, doors, windows and cement; and there
9 are 165 applications for such assistance at CD and addi-
10 tional applications at Housing, which would total at least
11 \$50,000 to \$100,000; and

12 WHEREAS, there are many emergency situations which arise each year
13 which require additional materials for repairs; and

14 WHEREAS, CD has spent \$15,000 this year to assist with 70 houses
15 and has only \$2,500 budget remaining; and the purchase of
16 such materials is a servere drain on the CD budget; and

17 WHEREAS, the CD and TWEPE Offices have established an effective
18 method to control and assure efficient use of such materials

19 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOVED by the Papago Council that:

20 They do recognize the seriousness of this problem; and
21 They do authorize the Community Development program to
22 continue their direct assistance to low income families
23 and to provide small loans for materials to higher income
24 families;

25 They do appeal to the Bureau of Indian Affairs and to all
26 other agencies to provide additional funds to assist with
27 the purchase of materials for the construction and repair
28 of village housing, in the amount of at least \$40,000
29 during the present fiscal year; and

30 They do authorize the Chairman and his delegates to take
31 such actions as may be required to seek out and obtain
32 the funds necessary for this purpose.

1 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council
2 on the 24th day of July, 1975, at a meeting at which a quorum was
3 present with a vote of 834,0 for, 0 against, 0 not voting,
4 and 2 absent; pursuant to authority vested in the Papago Council
5 by Section 3 (a) of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of
6 the Papago Tribe of Arizona ratified by the Tribe on December 12,
7 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6,
8 1937 (48 Stat. 984) pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18,
9 1934. Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval
10 by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency and is subject to review
11 by the Secretary of the Interior.
