NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY the Papago Council that it does 21 22 hereby request the United States Attorney to represent 23 the Papago Housing Authority in all legal proceedings 24 involved in connection with Civil Cause of Action No. 75-25 100 TUC. on file in the United States District Court of 26 Arizona, and does hereby authorize Cecil Williams, Chairman 27 of the Papago Council, to execute any and all consents 28 or other instruments necessary for substitution of councel, 29 or otherwise, in order to facilitate the purposes of this 30 Resolution. 31 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 24th day of July, 1975, at a meeting at which a quorum
