

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

RES. NO. 52-75

1 WHEREAS, it appears likely that the Papago Reservation has large
2 mineral deposits other than those known at the present
3 time; and

4 WHEREAS, all mineral exploration on the Reservation has in the past
5 been performed by outside companies under Tribal Prospect-
6 ing Permits; and

7 WHEREAS, members of the Tribal Council and the mining Committee have
8 expressed an interest in the Tribe becoming directly in-
9 volved in mineral exploration on the Reservation; and

10 WHEREAS, the Tribe would be in a much stronger negotiation position
11 if it could discover its own orebodies, and could possibly
12 be in a position in the future to develop its own mines;
13 and

14 WHEREAS, the Bureau of Indian Affairs, the U.S. Bureau of Mines and
15 the U.S. Geological Survey have proposed a program to
16 perform some exploration on the Reservation to help the
17 Tribe locate minerals, including an aeromagnetic survey
18 of the Reservation, gravity survey of potential mineralized
19 areas, photo interpretation and geologic reconnaissance,
20 geochemical surveys, sampling of known mineral Deposits,
21 and possible drilling if potential ore deposits are in-
22 dicated, which exploration will be funded by the Bureau
23 of Indian Affairs, at no cost to the Tribe, over a five
24 year period, with expenditures in the first year of \$250,000.

25 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Papago Council approves the
26 mineral exploration program proposed in Inter-agency
27 Agreement No. 3 (FY 1976) Phase II mineral Studies and
28 that the details of the program will be finalized and
29 approved by the mining Director and the Mining Committee
30 of the Papago Council.

31 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on
32 the 24th day of July, 1975, at a meeting at which a quorum was

1 present with a vote of 793.5 for, 40.5 against, 0 not voting,
2 and 1 absent; pursuant to authority vested in the Papago Council
3 by Section 2 (c), (d), (e) and Sec. 3 (h) of Article V of the
4 Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona ratified
5 by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary
6 of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the
7 Act of June 18, 1934. Said Resolution is effective as of the date
8 of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency and is
9 not subject to review by the Secretary of the Interior.
