

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO COUNCIL  
(Budget 75-76)

RES. NO. 68-75

1 WHEREAS, The Papago Council has reviewed the recommended budgets submitted by  
2 the various department heads: and

3 WHEREAS, The Papago Council desires to continue the expansion of economic and  
4 growth opportunities on the Papago Reservation: and

5 WHEREAS, the future potential growth in educational, health, welfare opportuni-  
6 ties, mining, utilities, industrial and social economic development  
7 requires increased expenditures and operating capital on contracts  
8 for this fiscal year! and

9 WHEREAS, the Tribe anticipates receiving revenues sufficient to cover the  
10 Tribal budget for this fiscal year, but Tribal revenues may be insuffi-  
11 cient for operating capital to cover the Tribal programs and contracts: and

12 WHEREAS, in order to guarantee that Tribal employees and just creditors will  
13 be paid, the Tribal Council passed a resolution authorizing the Chairman  
14 to establish a method of borrowing funds with repayments to be made from  
15 a percentage of the net smelter receipts due the Tribe from the Hecla or  
16 body.

17 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Papago Council hereby adopts the budget  
18 of the Papago Tribe as established, a copy of which is attached hereto  
19 and made a part hereof, at a total figure of ONE MILLION FOUR HUNDRED  
20 TWENTY-SEVEN THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED THIRTY-THREE DOLLARS (\$1,427,533.)  
21 being the operating budget for the fiscal year July 1, 1975 to June  
22 30, 1976.

23 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on September  
24 19, 1975 at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 705.5 for:  
25 96.5 against: 32.0 not voting: and 0 absent: pursuant to authority  
26 vested in the Papago Council by Section 3 (a) of Article V of the Constitution  
27 and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona, ratified by the Tribe on December  
28 12, 1936 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pur-  
29 suant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934. Said Resolution if effective  
30 as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency and  
31 is subject to review by the Secretary of the Interior.
