

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO COUNCIL
(Amendment to Resolution No. 61-74)

RES. NO. 76-75

1 WHEREAS, alcoholism and severe drinking are major problems among the Papago
2 people and do severely disrupt family community life; and

3 WHEREAS, recognizing the need for an alcoholism rehabilitation program, the
4 Papago Council, by Resolution No. 1-73, did authorize the Chairman of
5 the Alcoholism Prevention Program and the Executive Health Staff to
6 call upon tribal resources to support the establishment of an alcoho-
7 lism rehabilitation facility; and

8 WHEREAS, in conformity with said Resolution, the Papago Halfway House program
9 was established; and

10 WHEREAS, the Papago Halfway House program requires funding for the period
11 starting July 1, 1975 and ending June 30, 1976.

12 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that Cecil Williams, Chairman of the Papago
13 Tribe, is hereby authorized and directed to sign, on behalf of the
14 Tribe, a contract with the Bureau of Indian Affairs to provide per-
15 sonnel, materials, equipment, facilities and services to operate the
16 Papago Halfway House on the Papago Reservation.

17 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 23rd
18 day of September, 1975, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote
19 of 731 for; 155 against; 0 not voting; and 2 absent; pursuant
20 to authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (e) and (f) of Article V
21 of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona ratified by the
22 Tribe on December 12, 1936 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on
23 January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934. Said
24 Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent
25 of the Papago Agency and is not subject to review by the Secretary of the
26 Interior.




