

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

RES. NO. 77-75

1 WHEREAS, the Papago Tribe and the Bureau of Indian Affairs have entered into
2 a contract (No. H50C14209345) under the terms of which the Papago Trib
3 has agreed to furnish Grounds Maintenance Services for the Santa Rosa
4 Boarding School Between January 1, 1975, and December 31, 1975; and

5 WHEREAS, an addition to the Santa Rosa Boarding School is about to be completed
6 and further Grounds Maintenance Services will be required to service
7 such addition from the date of its completion, to December 31, 1975,
8 last day of the original Grounds Maintenance Services Contract; and

9 WHEREAS, it is to the benefit of the Bureau of Indian Affairs, the Papago Tribe
10 and of the Santa Rosa Boarding School, that grounds maintenance servic
11 for the entire expanded school be provided by a single agency.

12 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that the Papago Tribe requ
13 the Bureau of Indian Affairs to provide the funds necessary for all
14 required grounds maintenance services for the expanded Santa Rosa Boar
15 School, and that it does heeby authorize and direct the Chairman of
16 the Papago Council to negotiate and sign, on behalf of the Papago
17 Tribe, and Addendum to Contract No. H50C14209345, or a separate
18 agreement, whereby the Papago Tribe will furnish the Grounds Maintenanc
19 Services to the newly completed addition to the Santa Rosa Boarding
20 School for the unexpired term of said Contract.

21 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 25th
22 day of September, 1975, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote
23 of 834.0 for; 0 against; 0 not voting; and 2 absent, pursuant to
24 authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (a) of Article V of the
25 Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December
26 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937
27 (48 Stat. 984) pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934. Said
28 Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of
29 the Papago Agency, and is not subject ot review by the Secretary of the
30 Interior.
