

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

RES. NO. 81-75

1 WHEREAS, the Papago Tribe is in desperate need of a new Criminal Justice Facility  
2 at Sells, Arizona; and

3 WHEREAS, by Resolution No. 4-75, the Papago Council has already filed an urgent  
4 request with the Bureau of Indian Affairs and the Office of Management  
5 and Budget for funds to budget necessary Law Enforcement Services and  
6 Facilities; and

7 WHEREAS, the Papago Council understands that construction funds for Criminal  
8 Justice Facilities have been included in the 1976 Congressional Appro-  
9 priation Bill which has already been passed by the House and approved  
10 by the Office of Management and Budget, which construction funds may  
11 soon be made available to the Bureau of Indian Affairs.

12 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Papago Council hereby urgently petitions  
13 the Area Director of the Bureau of Indian Affairs and/or the Commis-  
14 sioner of Indian Affairs forthwith to take the necessary steps to  
15 secure the funds and plans necessary to construct a new Criminal Justice  
16 Facility at Sells, Arizona, on the Papago Reservation.

17 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 8th day  
18 of October, 1975, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of  
19 834.0 for; 0 against; 0 not voting; and 0 absent, pursuant  
20 to authority vested in the Papago Council by Sections 2 (a) (d) and (h) of  
21 Article V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe, ratified by the  
22 Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on  
23 January 6, 1937, (48 Stat: 984) pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18,  
24 1934. Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the  
25 Superintendent of the Papago Agency and is not subject to review by the Secretary  
26 of the Interior.
