

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

RES. NO. 85-75

1 WHEREAS, the Papago Indian Tribe is currently developing long range planning to
2 aid the Tribe in their quest for Papago self-sufficiency and self-
3 determination; and
4 WHEREAS, the Papago Tribal Government Administration Center has been a high
5 priority item of the Papago Tribe for many years; and
6 WHEREAS, the present overcrowded and antiquated Tribal Administration offices
7 seriously impede efficient Tribal government administration and thus
8 restrict Tribal advancement and self-sufficiency; and
9 WHEREAS, the Tribe has filed an application with the Economic Development Admin-
10 istration for assistance in constructing a Papago Capitol Complex; and
11 WHEREAS, the EDA granted the Tribe \$664,000 for the first phase of the Complex
12 including a combined Council Hall and Administrative office building;
13 and
14 WHEREAS, the preliminary drawings and floor plan and model of the building have
15 been prepared by Trico International, Inc., of 1109 North Sickle Drive,
16 Tempe, Arizona; and
17 WHEREAS, an agreement must be consumated with an architectural and engineer firm
18 before the project can proceed.
19 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that the Chairman of the
20 Papago Council be authorized to take any and all steps necessary to
21 consumate an agreement for this project with Trico International, Inc.
22 and on all other matters relating to the successful completion of the
23 Papago Capitol Complex.
24 The foregoing resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on November 7,
25 1975 at a meeting at which a quorum was present, with a vote of 834.0 for;
26 0 against; 0 not voting; and 0 absent, pursuant to the
27 authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2(d) of Article V of the Con-
28 stitution of the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary
29 of the Interior on January 6, 1937 (48 Stat. 984) pursuant to Section 16 of the
30 Act of June 18, 1934. Said Resolution is effective upon passage by the Papago
31 Council and is not subject to reveiw by the Secretary of the Interior.
