7	WHEREAS,	members of the Papago Tribe, regardless of their income, are unable to
8		acquire decent, safe, and sanitary housing due to the fact that all of
9		the land (except for a small amount of allotments) are held in trust
10		by the U. S. Government and cannot be encumbered by any type of mort-
11		gage or lien and the vast distance from housing markets destroys any
12		possibility of private industry building individual Indian homes; and
13	WHEREAS,	H.U.D. projects now in the process of being approved have certain
14		individual Papago applicants whose income level might cause them to be
15		disqualified (26-6, 26-8, 26-9, 26-15, and 26-16) and if disqualified
16		these individual Papago Indians will not be able to acquire housing
17		from any local housing market or builder; and
18	WHERĖAS,	it is in the best interest of the Papago Tribe if all existing rules
19		and regulations regarding maximum income level of Papago members as an
20	•	element of qualifying for H.U.D. housing be wavied and that the Pro-
21		posed New Rules should be amended or revised to correct this injustice
22		to the Papago People.
23	NOW, THE	REFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that the Papago Tribe
24		believes that it is essential and hereby requests that all restrictions
25	!	placed on the maximum income a Papago Indian can earn to be eligible
26	! ! !	for H.U.D. housing be wavied by the Secretary in regards to all existing
27		projects now in process (26-6, 26-8, 26-9. 26-15, and 26-16) and all
28		future projects; and
29	BE IT FU	RTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Housing and Urban Development's
30	; 	new proposed rules (24 CFR Part 805 Subpart C) eliminate the maximum
31		income level that a Papago Indian can earn to qualify for H.U.D. hous-

7	January 6, 1937 (48 Stat: 984), pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18,
8	1934. Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the
9	Superintendent of the Papago Agency and is not subject to review by the Secre-
10	tary of the Interior.
