

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL

RES. NO. 12-77

1 WHEREAS, the Papago Reservation is now served by both the Food Distri-
2 bution and the Food Stamp Program; and

3 WHEREAS, there are approximately three hundred (300) families using
4 the Food Stamp Program and six hundred (600) families using
5 the Food Distribution Program; and

6 WHEREAS, the present law authorizing the Food Distribution Program
7 will expire on September 30, 1977; and

8 WHEREAS, due to isolation, distance, lack of cold storage and extreme
9 poverty, the Food Distribution Program is still essential
10 to many parts of the Reservation; and

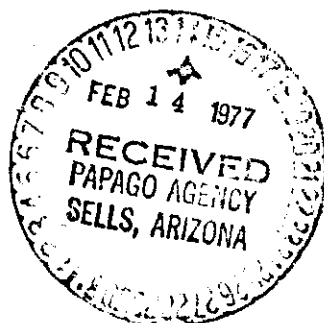
11 WHEREAS, the need for the Food Distribution Program has been demon-
12 strated by the serious problems occurring in those reserva-
13 tions where the Program has been terminated.

14 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that it does
15 consider the continuation of both Programs essential to meet
16 the needs of its people.

17 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Council does appeal to the U. S.
18 Congress and Department of Agriculture to amend existing
19 legislation as necessary to authorize and fund the continu-
20 ation of the Food Distribution Program on all reservations.

21 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on
22 the 4th day of February, 1977, at a meeting at which a quorum was
23 present with a vote of 834.0 for; 0 against; 0 not vot-
24 ing; and 0 absent, pursuant to the authority vested in the
25 Council by Section 2 (d) of Article V of the Constitution and By-laws
26 of the Papago Tribe as amended, ratified by the Papago Tribe on
27 December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of Interior on Janu-
28 ary 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48
29 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is not subject to review by the Secretary
30 of the Interior and is effective as of the date of its enactment by
31 the Papago Council.
