

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL

RES. NO. 14-77

1 WHEREAS, it is contemplated that upon completion of construction of  
2 the San Simon School all school children presently enrolled  
3 in the school at Kerwo shall be transferred to the San Simon  
4 School; and


5 WHEREAS, the Bureau of Indian Affairs does not appear to have any need  
6 or use for the old school facilities at Kerwo, and such  
7 facilities would serve a substantial need and provide a sub-  
8 stantial benefit to the Gu Vo District if they were trans-  
9 ferred or assigned to the District.

10 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that it does  
11 hereby request that the Bureau of Indian Affairs transfer or  
12 assign any unused school facilities, including buildings,  
13 lands and contents located in Kerwo to the Gu Vo District to  
14 be used for such purposes as its District Council shall  
15 direct.


16 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chairman and Secretary of the Gu Vo  
17 District Council are hereby authorized, on behalf of the  
18 Papago Tribe, to receive and receipt for any such facilities  
19 transferred or assigned to the District by the Bureau of  
20 Indian Affairs pursuant to the request contained in this  
21 Resolution.

22 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on  
23 the 22nd day of February, 1977, at a meeting at which a quorum was  
24 present with a vote of 834.0 for; 0 against; 0 not vot-  
25 ing; and 2 absent, pursuant to the authority vested in the  
26 Council by Section 2 (a) (d) (e) and (f) of Article V and Section 4  
27 of Article VIII of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe  
as amended, ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and  
approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant  
to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Reso-  
lution is not subject to review by the Secretary of the Interior and  
is effective as of the date of its enactment by the Papago Council.
