

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL

RES. NO. 17-77

1 WHEREAS, the Papago Tribe of Arizona has reviewed and analyzed the
2 1974 Housing and Community Development Act; and

3 WHEREAS, Indian Tribes have realized benefits from legislation which
4 specifically address itself to Indians or specifically re-
5 quire a percentage and/or set amount of the appropriation
6 to be directed to Indians for the Public Works and Economic
7 Development Act of 1965, as amended P.L. 89-136; and

8 WHEREAS, the Papago people still suffer from such basic needs as,
9 electrification, roads and water for domestic use.

10 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that Title I of
11 the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974,
12 P.L. 93-383, be amended to provide a specific set aside for
13 Indian communities.

14 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the amount of the set aside be commensu-
15 rate with the development needs of Indian communities.

16 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the full Act be amended where appropriate
17 and necessary to recognize and reflect the unique legal
18 relationships of Indian communities.

19 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chairman of the Papago Tribal Council
20 be authorized to take any and all steps he deems necessary
21 to convey this resolution and its intent to the appropriate
22 H.U.D. officials.

23 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on
24 the 4th day of March, 1977, at a meeting at which a quorum was present
25 with a vote of 834.0 for; 0 against; 0 not voting; and 0 absent, pur-
26 suant to the authority vested in the Council by Section 2 (a) (d) and
27 (h) of Article V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe
28 as amended, ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and
29 approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant
30 to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Reso-
31 lution is not subject to review by the Secretary of Interior and is
32 effective as of the date of its enactment by the Papago Council.
