

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

RES. NO. 24-77

1 WHEREAS, the Papago Tribe of Arizona has a long range planning pro-
2 gram; and

3 WHEREAS, upon consideration of said program the Papago Council has
4 examined the various needs of the reservation; and

5 WHEREAS, certain of those needs are of critical immediate importance
6 and do require assistance from special Appropriations of
7 FY-78 federal funds; and

8 WHEREAS, the cooperation and assistance of various Federal Agencies
9 and of the United States Congress is required;


10 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that it does
11 hereby designate (1) Tribal Government Development; (2)
12 Housing, Water and Community Development; (3) Education;
13 (4) Law Enforcement and the Judicial System; and (5) Roads,
14 as aspects of the Tribe's long range planning program show-
15 ing the greatest needs, and does hereby authorize the
16 Chairman of the Papago Council and his staff to prepare,
17 submit and request proper funding and coordination as is
18 necessary to meet these needs.

19 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on
20 the 1st day of April, 1977, at a meeting at which a quorum was present
21 with a vote of 834.0 for; 0 against; 0 not voting; and 0 absent, pur-
22 suant to authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (d) of
23 Article V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of
24 Arizona ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved
25 by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Sec-
26 tion 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution
27 is not subject to review by the Secretary of Interior and is effective
28 as of the date of its enactment by the Papago Council.
