

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL

RES. NO. 25-77

1 WHEREAS, the Papago Tribe did receive under Contract No. H50C1420070 from the  
 2 Bureau of Indian Affairs a federal grant under P.L. 73-167 (Johnson-  
 3 O' Malley Act) to provide financial educational assistance through supple-  
 4 mental and operational support programs to be administered both in and  
 5 outside the Indian Oasis School District No. 40 for the education of eli-  
 6 gible Indian children residing on or near the Papago Reservation; and

7 WHEREAS, pursuant to the recommendations of the Indian Education Parents Committees  
 8 established pursuant to P.L. 73-167 and of the Papago Education Committee,  
 9 and in accordance with Resolution No. 21-76 of the Papago Council, the  
 10 Papago Tribe did receive a grant in the sum of \$173,500.00 as a Budget-  
 11 Operational Support Program for Indian Oasis School District No. 40 to  
 12 cover the following administrative expenses of the District:

17 WHEREAS, Indian Oasis School District has advised the Papago Council and the State  
 18 Board of Education that a financial emergency exists and has requested  
 19 the State Board of Education, in accordance with A.R.S. 15-1143, to accept  
 20 such funds appropriated by Act of Congress; and


21 WHEREAS, it would be to the benefit of the eligible Indian children on or near the  
 22 Papago Reservation if such funds are made available to the State Board of  
 23 Education for the purpose of apportioning same to Indian Oasis School  
 24 District No. 40, to the end that such funds can be expended by the Dis-  
 25 trict for the purposes and in that manner set forth in the federal grant  
 26 as provided in A.R.S. 15-1142 (B).

27 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that it does hereby offer the  
 28 sum of \$173,500 Congressionally appropriated Johnson-O'Malley grant funds  
 29 to the State Board of Education for the exclusive benefit of Indian Oasis  
 30 School District No. 40 to be expended for the purposes and in the manner  
 31 set forth in the foregoing Budget-Operational Support Program of said  
 32 grant.


1 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that, upon receiving written advice from the Pima County  
2 School Superintendent that the State Board of Education has accepted such  
3 funds for the benefit of, and apportioned such funds to Indian Oasis  
4 School District No. 40 in the manner set forth in the foregoing Budget-  
5 Operational Support Program, and that Pima County Board of Supervisors  
6 has authorized expenditure of such funds in excess of the District's  
7 budget, the Treasurer of the Papago Tribe is hereby authorized and directed  
8 to deliver to the Pima County School Superintendent a check for \$173,500.00  
9 made payable to Indian Oasis School District No. 40 for deposit with the  
10 Pima County Treasurer.

11 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 6th day of  
12 April, 1977, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 834.0 for;  
13 0 against; 0 not voting; and 2 absent, pursuant to the authority vested in the  
14 Council by Section 2 (a) (d) (f) of Article V of the Consitution and By-laws of  
15 the Papago Tribe as amended, ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and  
16 approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section  
17 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is not subject to  
18 review by the Secretary of Interior and is effective as of the date of its enact-  
19 ment by the Papago Council.
