

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL

RES. NO. 2-77

1 WHEREAS, it is contemplated that upon completion of construction of  
2 the San Simon School all school children presently enrolled  
3 in the school at Vaya Chin shall be transferred to the  
4 San Simon School; and

5 WHEREAS, the Bureau of Indian Affairs does not appear to have any  
6 need or use for the old school facilities at Vaya Chin,  
7 and such facilities would serve a substantial need and pro-  
8 vide a substantial benefit to the Hickiwan District if  
9 they were transferred or assigned to the District.

10 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that it does  
11 hereby request that the Bureau of Indian Affairs transfer  
12 or assign any unused school facilities, including build-  
13 ings, lands and contents located in Vaya Chin to the  
14 Hickiwan District to be used for such purposes as its  
15 District Council shall direct.


16 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chairman and Secretary of the Hicki-  
17 wan District Council are hereby authorized, on behalf of  
18 the Papago Tribe, to receive and receipt for any such  
19 facilities transferred or assigned to the District by the  
20 Bureau of Indian Affairs pursuant to the request contained  
21 in this Resolution.

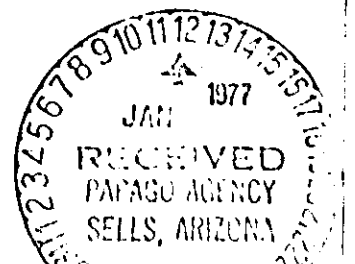
22 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on  
23 the 7th day of January, 1977, at a meeting at which a quorum was  
24 present with a vote of 834.0 for; 0 against; 0 not voting; and 0  
25 absent, pursuant to the authority vested in the Council by Section  
26 2 (a) (d) (e) and (f) of Article V and Section 4 of Article VIII  
27 of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe as amended,  
28 ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by  
29 the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to  
30 Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Reso-  
31 lution is not subject to review by the Secretary of the Interior  
32 and is effective as of the date of its enactment by the Papago  
Council.
