1	WHEREAS, the people of the Papago Reservation have endured hardships from natural								
2		and unnatural disasters; and							
3	WHEREAS,	REAS, the Papago Tribe does not have an emergency plan for disaster situations							
4		occurring on the Papago Reservation; and							
5	WHEREAS,	REAS, by directions of the Chairman of the Papago Council an Emergency Prepared-							
6		ness Committee (EPC) has been established to develop a disaster plan; and							
7	WHEREAS,	HEREAS, the present Emergency Preparedness Committee had on two occasions set up							
8		an operations center in anticipation of a natural calamity that was heade							
9		towards the Papago Reservation; and							
10	WHEREAS, on the two occasions mentioned above, the disaster operations center acted								
11		with little or no authority; and							
12	WHEREAS,	in order for the Emergency Preparedness Committee when mobilized, needs to							
13		function with complete authority in safeguarding the health and welfare							
14		for the people on the Papago Reservation.							
15	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Papago Council does delegate authority to								
16		the Emergency Preparedness Committee to exercise this authority only in							
17		the time of an emergency or a disaster of any nature.							
18	The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 6th day of April 1977 at a meeting at which a guorum was present with a wate of 824.0 form								
19	April, 1977, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 834.0 for; 0 against; 0 not voting; and 1 absent, pursuant to authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (b) of Article V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago								
20	Council by Section 2 (h) of Article V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe, as amended, ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of								
21	Juan 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is not subject to review by the Secretary of Interior and is effective as of the date of its enactment by the								
22	Papago Council.
