1	WHEREAS, the Gunsight Mining Corporation, or its successors or assigns, claim
2	ownership to, or rights by reason of, certain unpatented mining claims
3	located on the Papago Indian Reservation, the names and location notices
4	of which were recorded as set out in the attached Exhibit "A"; and
5	WHEREAS, the Papago Council has been advised by the Bureau of Land Management of
6	the Department of Interior that all of said unpatented mining claims
7	have by proper proceedings been declared to be null and void; and
8	WHEREAS, the Gunsight Mining Corporation, its successors or assigns, have conse-
9	quently no right, title or interest in and to said unpatented mining
10	claims, or in and to the surface of, or the lands constitution such
11	claims; and
12	WHEREAS, the Gunsight Mining Corporation, its successors or assigns, acting by or
13	through its officers, agents or attorneys, continues to assert or claim
14	some right, title or interest therein, and continues to perform labor or
15	assessment work upon or for the benefit of such claims; and
16	WHEREAS, all of such labor or assessment work on, and assertion of claim of right
17	title or interest in, such claims constitutes a trespass and cloud upon
18	the lands of the Papago Tribe.
19	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that it does hereby request
20	the proper departments, officers, attorneys or persons in the Department
21	of Interior or the Department of Justice to do such thing, or institute
22	such action, in the name or on behalf of the Papago Tribe, as is neces-
23	sary to stop or prevent the further use or occupancy of, or cloud or
24	trespass to the surface or lands describes in, and resulting from, the
25	unpatented mining claims named in the attached Exhibit "A".
26	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the proper departments, officers or attorneys of the
27	Papago Council be and they hereby are authorized and directed to perform
28	all acts necessary or desirable to give effect to this Resolution.
29	The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 26th day
30	of May, 1977, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 834.0 for;
31	0 against; 0 not voting; and 4 absent, pursuant to the authority
32	vested in the Council by Section 2 (a) (c) and (d) of Article V of the Constitution
