


RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL

RES. NO. 35-77


1 WHEREAS, the previous Secretary of the Department of Interior, Thomas S. Kleppe,  
2 did allocate the Central Arizona Project water of the different entities  
3 in the State of Arizona, including the Five Central Arizona Tribes; and  
4 WHEREAS, the amount of CAP water allocated to the Papago Tribe is wholly unaccept-  
5 able and inconsistent with the total data and pertinent material sub-  
6 mitted in regards thereto; and  
7 WHEREAS, the Papago Tribe feels that said allocation should be reexamined in light  
8 of the main priorities set forth by the President of the United States,  
9 i. e. Enviornmental, social and Indians; and  
10 WHEREAS, to adequately understand the total position of the Papago Tribe, a con-  
11 ference with Secretary Cecil Andrus would be desirable and necessary.  
12 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Tribal Council that Secretary Cecil  
13 Andrus be requested to re-evaluate the previous Secretary's allocation  
14 of CAP water and that the Tribal Chairman, on behalf of the Papago Tribe,  
15 and in conjunction with the other Four Central Arizona Tribes request an  
16 early conference with Secretary Cecil Andrus.

17 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 26th day  
18 of May, 1977, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 834.0 for;  
19 0 against; 0 not voting; and 5 absent, pursuant to the authority  
20 vested in the Council by Section 2 (a) and (d) of Article V of the Constitution  
21 and By-laws of the Papago Tribe as amended, ratified by the Papago Tribe on  
22 December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of Interior on January 6, 1937,  
23 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution  
24 is not subject to review by the Secretary of Interior and is effective as of the  
25 date of its enactment by the Papago Council.
