9	WHEREAS,	the Tribe does have a Construction Department which they
10		have deliberately staffed and equipped to perform all level
11		of construction needed on the Reservation; and
12	WHEREAS,	said Department has a crew of forty (40) trained men, 90%
13		of whom are Papago, has a fully experienced general manager
14		and has successfully completed five other E.D.A. projects
15		and a number of major commercial projects; and
16	WHEREAS,	the Department has successfully met certain preconditions
17		for consideration as verbally stated by E.D.A. representa-
18		tives, to wit the successfully completion, ahead of schedul
19		of the San Lucy Community Building; and
20	WHEREAS,	E.D.A. regulations do permit Tribal construction of this
21		project via the force account procedure and said procedure
22	ŀ	will result in improved coordination and the greatest
23		benefit to the Papago people.
24	NOW, THE	REFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that it does
25		request the Economic Development Administration to authorize
26		construction of the Tribal Government Complex by the Papago

29		all necessary formal applications to E.D.A. concerning this
