

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL

RES. NO. 38-77

1 WHEREAS, the Papago Tribe of Arizona is presently operating the following programs
2 under FY-77 P.L. 93-638 service contracts with the Bureau of Indian
3 Affairs:

- 4 - Papago Children's Home
- 5 - Papago Agricultural Services
- 6 - Papago Court
- 7 - Papago JOM Education
- 8 - Papago Halfway House
- 9 - Tribal Work Experience Program (T.W.E.P.)
- 10 - Papago Education Office (Community Education); and

11 WHEREAS, such tribal operations have been successful and beneficial to the Papago
12 Tribe and its people; and

13 WHEREAS, 25 CFR Sec. 271.20 of the Federal Regulations requires that all proposals
14 to recontract under P.L. 93-638 be submitted to the Tribal Council for
15 approval at least 120 days prior to the contract termination; and

16 WHEREAS, the Papago Council does desire to recontract for provision of these ser-
17 vices during FY-78.

18 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that it does authorize and
19 request the Bureau of Indian Affairs to contract with the Papago Tribe
20 under P.L. 93-638 regulations and procedures for the provision of ser-
21 vices titled:

- 22 - Papago Children's Home
- 23 - Papago Agricultural Services
- 24 - Papago Court
- 25 - Papago JOM Education
- 26 - Papago Halfway House
- 27 - Tribal Work Experience Program (T.W.E.P.)
- 28 - Papago Education Office (Community Education)

29 and in accordance with the attached work programs, staffing and budget
30 requests.

31 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Mr. Cecil Williams, Chairman or in his absence, Mr.
32 Max Norris, Vice Chairman, or Mr. Vincent Crawford, Treasures is hereby

1 authorized to negotiate and execute these contracts and any amendments
2 thereto for the duration of the contracts.


3 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the duration of these contracts shall be from
4 October 1, 1977 to September 30, 1978, but may be extended by mutual
5 agreement of both parties.

6 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 26th day of
7 May, 1977, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 801.0 for;
8 0 against; 33.0 not voting; and 4 absent, pursuant to authority vested in the
9 Papago Council by Section 2 (a) of Article V of the Constitution and By-laws of
10 the Papago Tribe of Arizona, ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936 and approved
11 by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the
12 Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is not subject to review by
13 the Secretary of Interior and is effective as of the date of its enactment by the
14 Papago Council.
