

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

RES. NO. 43-77

1 WHEREAS, the Papago Tribe has a continued need for a Highway Safety Program to
2 provide expert advice and assistance in minimizing the high automobile
3 accident fatalities and injuries on the Papago reservation roads; and
4 WHEREAS, the Papago Council wishes to continue to accept the responsibility for
5 Tribal participation in a Highway Safety Program and to commit services
6 of other Tribal programs, the Bureau of Indian Affairs and the State of
7 Arizona; and
8 WHEREAS, the Papago Tribe is now able to itself administer and provide such
9 services; and
10 WHEREAS, the Bureau of Indian Affairs has funds appropriated from the Department
11 of Transportation to provide grants to Tribes for such services during
12 Fiscal Year 1977.
13 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that it does hereby request
14 a grant/contract with the Bureau of Indian Affairs to provide a general
15 Highway Safety Program in accordance with the attached Tribal staffing
16 and funding requests submitted in accordance with the Department of
17 Transportation, Annual Work Program application requirements.
18 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Mr. Cecil Williams, Chairman, or in his absence, Mr.
19 Max H. Norris, Vice Chairman or Mr. Vincent Crawford, Treasurer, hereby
20 be authorized to negotiate and execute the grant/contract or amendments
21 thereto for the duration of the contract.
22 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this grant/contract shall begin on June 1, 1977 and
23 end September 30, 1978 and may be extended by mutual agreement of both
24 parties.
25 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 26th day
26 of May, 1977, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 801.0 for;
27 5 against; 33.0 not voting; and 4 absent, pursuant to authority vested
28 in the Papago Council by Section 2 (a) of Article V of the Constitution and By-laws
29 of the Papago Tribe of Arizona, ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936 and
30 approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section
31 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is not subject to
32 review by the Secretary of Interior and is effective as of the date of its enact-
ment by the Papago Council.
