

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL.

RES. NO. 45-77

1 WHEREAS, the Papago Tribe and the Papago Council wish to develop their agricultur
2 and livestock economy; and
3 WHEREAS, preliminary development efforts are already underway at Papago Farms and
4 Vaiva Vo; and
5 WHEREAS, facilities for feeding, sale and other livestock operations are now
6 available in Sells; and
7 WHEREAS funds are available for such economic development efforts through P.L.
8 93-638 grants and contracts with the Bureau of Indian Affairs, Indian
9 Action Team office in Denver; and
10 WHEREAS, it is to the best interest of the Tribe and its people to obtain such
11 grant or contract funding in order to develop these important projects.
12 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that they do request the
13 Bureau of Indian Affairs to execute a grant or contract with the Papago
14 Tribe for development of the agricultural and livestock economy on this
15 reservation in accordance with the attached work program, staffing and
16 budget requests.
17 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Mr. Cecil Williams, Chairman, or in his absence, Mr.
18 Max H. Norris, Vice Chairman, or Mr. Vincent Crawford, Treasurer, is
19 hereby authorized to negotiate and execute the contract and any amendments
20 thereto during the duration of the contract.
21 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the term of this grant or contract shall begin as
22 soon as possible and shall end as is determined by mutual agreement of
23 both parties.
24 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 3rd day of
25 June, 1977, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 834.0 for;
26 0 against; 0 not voting; and 2 absent, pursuant to authority vested in the
27 Papago Council by Section 2 (a) of Article V of the Constitution and By-laws of
28 the Papago Tribe of Arizona, ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936 and approved
29 by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937 pursuant to Section 16 of the
30 Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 934). Said Resolution is not subject to review by
31 the Secretary of Interior and is effective as of the date of its enactment by the
32 Papago Council.
