

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL

RES. NO. 58-77

1 WHEREAS, the Bureau of Indian Affairs is presently operating the
2 following programs under FY 1977:

3 -Santa Rosa Boarding and Day School

4 -Covered Wells Kindergarten

5 -Ventana Kindergarten

6 -San Simon School

7 -Santa Rosa Kindergarten

8 -Kerwo Kindergarten

9 -Santa Rosa Ranch Day School; and

10 WHEREAS, such Bureau operations have been beneficial to the Papago
11 Tribe, its people and specifically its youth; and

12 WHEREAS, the Bureau has staffed these programs with highly qualified
13 professional and para-professional staffs; and

14 WHEREAS, the Papago Tribe through delegations has continually lobbied
15 for increased position ceilings for each phase of new school
16 construction with continued assurances from various Congres-
17 sional and Bureau leaders of resultant ceiling increases.

18 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that it does
19 inquire as to why the Bureau of Indian Affairs, Papago Agency
20 is facing a reduction in force of approximately twenty-five
21 (25) positions; sixteen (16) of which are directly involved
22 in the education of Papago youth.


23 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Papago Council requests from the
24 Phoenix Area Director any documentation he may have substan-
25 tiating the increase in position ceiling for the Santa Rosa
26 Middle School and San Simon School or lack thereof.

27 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Papago Council does not support any
28 reduction in force attempted at the Bureau's Papago Agency
29 Schools, nor any action which may jeopardize the status of
30 individual or group employment.


31 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on
32 the 12th day of July, 1977, at a meeting at which a quorum was present

1 with a vote of 1065.0 for; 0 against; 0 not voting; and
2 1 absent, pursuant to authority vested in the Papago Council by
3 Section 2 (a) (d) & (k) of Article V of the Constitution and By-laws
4 of the Papago Tribe of Arizona ratified by the Tribe on December 12,
5 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6,
6 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat.
7 984). Said Resolution is not subject to review by the Secretary of
8 Interior and is effective as of the date of its enactment by the
9 Papago Council.
