WHEREAS, Substantial and persistent unemployment exists within the Papago Reservation; and

WHEREAS, Indian economic development and employment will be effectively stimulated if the Papago Tribe can construct, operate and sublease an industrial building on the Industrial Park of the San Xavier District.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council:

- and directed to execute a lease dated July 22, 1977, on behalf of the Papago Tribe with the Papago-Tucson Development Corporation to Lots 12 and 13 of the San Xavier Industrial Park, for a term of twenty-five (25) years, (with option to renew for a like term), with rental payments of 30% of gross receipts from sublessees, for the construction, operation and sublease of a 40,000 square foot industrial building to be known as the Papago Tribe Indian Business Opportunity Building, and to be financed by means of a grant from the Economic Development Administration of the U.S. Department of Commerce.
  - 2) That the above named Chairman of the Papago Council is hereby authorized to execute and file an application on behalf of the Papago Tribe of Ariz with the Economic Development Administration of the U.S. Department of Commerce for a grant to aid in financing the construction of a 40,000 square foot industrial building on the San Xavier Industrial Park for the purpose of stimulating Indian economic development and employment to be known as the Papago Tribe Indian Business Opportunity Building.
- 3) That the above named Chairman of the Papago Council is heraby authorized and directed to furnish such information as the Economic Development Administration may reasonably request in connection with the application which is herein authorized to be filed, and further is authorized to accept any offer of grant which may be tendered by the Economic Development Administration of the U.S. Department of Commerce.

The forcegoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 22nd day of July, 1977 at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of

967 for; 17.5 against; 80.5 not voting; and 4 absent, pursuant to the authority vested in the Council by Section 2 (a) and 3 (h) of Article V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe as amended, ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 2, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984) Said Resolution is not subject to review by the Secretary of the Interior and is effective as of the date of its enactment by the Papago Council.
