


RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

RES. NO. 62-77

1 WHEREAS, the Papago Tribe has a continued need for a Highway Safety
2 Program to provide expert advice and assistance in minimiz-
3 ing the high automobile accident fatalities and injuries
4 and property damage on the Papago Reservation roads; and
5 WHEREAS, the Papago Council wishes to continue to accept the respon-
6 sibility for Tribal participation in a Highway Safety Pro-
7 gram and to commit services of other Tribal Programs, the
8 Bureau of Indian Affairs and the State of Arizona; and
9 WHEREAS, the Papago Tribe is now able to itself administer and pro-
10 vide such services; and
11 WHEREAS, the Bureau of Indian Affairs has funds appropriated from
12 the Department of Transportation to provide grants to Tribes
13 for such services during Fiscal Year 1978.
14 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that it does
15 hereby request a grant/contract with the Bureau of Indian
16 Affairs to provide a general Highway Safety Program in
17 accordance with the attached Tribal staffing and funding
18 requests submitted in accordance with the Department of
19 Transportation Annual Work Program application requirements.
20 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Mr. Cecil Williams, Chairman, or in his
21 absence, the Vice Chairman or Treasurer, hereby be autho-
22 rized to negotiate and execute the grant/contract or amend-
23 ments thereto for the duration of the contract.
24 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this grant/contract shall begin on
25 October 1, 1977 and end September 30, 1978 and may be
26 extended or revised by mutual agreement of both parties.
27 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on
28 the 5th day of August, 1977, at a meeting at which a quorum was
29 present with a vote of 983.0 for; 0 against; 0 not
30 voting; and 5 absent, pursuant to authority vested in the
31 Papago Council by Section 2 (a) of Article V of the Constitution
32 and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona ratified by the Tribe on

1 December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on
2 January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934
3 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is not subject to review by the
4 Secretary of Interior and is effective as of the date of its enact-
5 ment by the Papago Council.
