

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL

RES. NO. 63-77


1 WHEREAS, the Papago Reservation by virtue of its geographic location in the Sonoran
2 Desert of Arizona is subject to recurrent drought conditions; and
3 WHEREAS, the Papago Tribe is seriously attempting to develop its abundant sources
4 of underground water throughout the Reservation in order to support its
5 agrarian economy; and
6 WHEREAS, under P.L. 95-31 (Community Emergency Drought Relief Act of 1977), the
7 Papago Tribe is eligible for special financial assistance from Economic
8 Development Administration in developing critically needed water resources
9 on the Reservation.

10 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Papago Tribe prepare and submit an appli-
11 cation to E.D.A. for (1) the drilling of nine new water wells, and (2)
12 for the rehabilitating of eleven existing wells at critically needed
13 places throughout the Reservation, and (3) purchase of two self-contained
14 water trucks and (4) one truck and low boy rig all at a total estimated
15 cost of \$612,515.


16 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chairman be authorized to take any and all steps
17 necessary to insure that this project application is funded and that the
18 project be properly coordinated and successfully completed.

19 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 5th day of
20 August, 1977, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 929.0
21 for; 54.0 against; 0 not voting; and 5 absent, pursuant to authority vested
22 in the Papago Council by Section 2 (d) of Article V of the and By-laws of the
23 Papago Tribe of Arizona ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936 and approved
24 by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 12 of the
25 Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is effective as of the date
26 of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency and is not subject to
27 review by the Secretary of the Interior.
