

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

RES. NO. 64-77

- 1 WHEREAS, the Papago Housing Authority heretofore has entered into an
2 Annual Contributions Contract with the Department of Housing
3 and Urban Development to develop ten (10) units of Conven-
4 tional Low-Rent Housing designated as Project No. AZ 26-8;
5 and
- 6 WHEREAS, there has been no disapproval of the Project by the local
7 governing body or by members of the Papago Indian Community;
8 and
- 9 WHEREAS, bids were received and opened May 24, 1977, at the time and
10 place designated in the invitation for bids; and
- 11 WHEREAS, Haver Construction Company was determined the lowest respon-
12 sible bidder; and
- 13 WHEREAS, the Papago Housing Authority hereby selects and awards the
14 contract to Haver Construction Company for Project AZ 26-8;
15 and
- 16 WHEREAS, the selection of the Haver Construction Company for Project
17 AZ 26-8, by the Papago Housing Authority, shall be endorsed
18 by the Papago Tribal Council, as requested by the Department
19 of Housing and Urban Development.
- 20 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Tribal Council that
21 endorsement is given to the Papago Housing Authority for
22 selection and award of contract to Haver Construction Com-
23 pany as contractor for Project AZ 26-8.
- 24 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Papago Tribal Council that it hereby
25 recommends approval of Award of Contract to the Haver Con-
26 struction Company subject to approval by the Department of
27 Housing and Urban Development.
- 28 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Papago Tribal Council that it hereby
29 authorizes the Chairman or authorized delegate, and the
30 Secretary of the Tribal Council to sign and execute the
31 documents necessary to effectuate the development of said
32 Project.

1 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on
2 the 11th day of August, 1977, at a meeting at which a quorum was pres-
3 ent with a vote of 654.5 for; 108.0 against; 311.5 not voting;
4 and 1 absent, pursuant to authority vested in the Papago Council
5 by Section 2 (a) and (h) of Article V of the Constitution and By-laws
6 of the Papago Tribe of Arizona ratified by the Tribe on December 12,
7 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6,
8 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat.
9 984). Said Resolution is not subject to review by the Secretary of
10 Interior and is effective as of the date of its enactment by the
11 Papago Council.
