

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL

RES. NO. 6-77

1 WHEREAS, the Papago Tribal Council passed Resolution No. 19-76 on
2 the 2nd day of April, 1976, a copy of said Resolution is
3 attached hereto and made a part hereof, at a meeting at
4 which a quorum was present with a vote of 834 for and 0
5 against, for the purpose of amending the Papago Constitu-
6 tion and By-laws in regards to Article II-Membership; and

7 WHEREAS, on December 8, 1976, a Field Solicitor's Opinion was writ-
8 ten wherein he stated that the Secretary of Interior has
9 had a long standing policy not to approve constitutional
10 amendments which act to disenroll current members in a Tribe,
11 a copy of said Opinion is attached hereto and made a part
12 hereof; and

13 WHEREAS, it is in the best interests of the Papago Tribe that an
14 Amendment be made to Res. 19-76 to conform to the Field
15 Solicitor's Opinion.

16 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Papago Council hereby amends
17 Resolution No. 19-76 by deleting the word "Papago" from
18 Article II, Section (1) (a), which shall then read as
19 follows:


- 20 (a) "All Indians whose names appear on the official
21 census rolls of the Sells and Gila Bend Reser-
22 vation as of January 1, 1937, and of the San
23 Xavier Reservation as of January 1, 1940, and
24 all children born to resident members, provided
that additions and changes may be made to said
rolls by the Papago Council, subject to the
approval of the Secretary of Interior."

25 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on
26 the 13th day of January, 1977, at a meeting at which a quorum was
27 present with a vote of 516.5 for; 33.0 against; 234.5 not voting;
28 and 0 absent; pursuant to authority vested in the Papago Council by
29 Article IX of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of
30 Arizona ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by
the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Sec-
tion 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (43 Stat. 984). Said Resolution
is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of
the Papago Agency, and is subject to review by the Secretary of the
Interior.

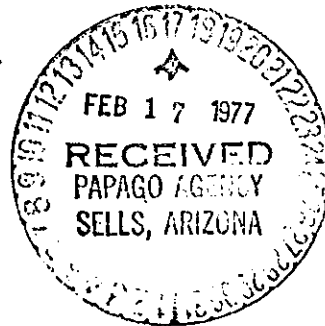
