

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL

RES. NO. 68-77

1 WHEREAS, the Indian Health Service and the Bureau of Indian Affairs have responsi-
2 bilities to oversee various aspects of Water and Range programs on the
3 Papago Reservation; and

4 WHEREAS, the Director of the Well Maintenance Department of the Papago Tribe did
5 on August 5, 1977 appear before the Papago Council to request support
6 and direction of the overall management of Water and Range Programs; and


7 WHEREAS, coordination is vital in the implementation of various Water and Range
8 programs.

9 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Papago Council hereby directs all agencies
10 such as Indian Health Service, Bureau of Indian Affairs, Papago Tribal
11 Utility Authority and any others to coordinate all their efforts with
12 the Papago Well Maintenance Department to secure proper implementation
13 of water services to the various villages on the Papago Reservation.


14 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Papago Council hereby instructs the Director of
15 the Well Maintenance Department to work with the various agencies to
16 develop a plan of operation which will help alleviate duplication of
17 efforts and maintain proper coordination.

18 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 2nd day
19 of Sept. 1977, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 786.5
20 for; 278.5 against; 0 not voting; and 0 absent, pursuant to authority
21 vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (a) and (h) of Article V of the Consti-
22 tution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona ratified by the Tribe on
23 December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6,
24 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said
25 Resolution is not subject to review by the Secretary of the Interior and is
26 effective as of the date of its enactment by the Papago Council.
