

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO COUNCIL
(Changing accounting year and setting carryover and
interim budgets)

RES. NO. 82-77

1 WHEREAS, on June 3, 1977, the Papago Council passed Resolution No. 47-77, changing
2 the Tribe's fiscal year from a starting date on July 1 to October 1 in
3 order to be in conformity with that of the federal government, and adopt-
4 ing a carryover budget for the period between the end of the Tribe's
5 current fiscal year and the beginning of its new fiscal year; and

6 WHEREAS, the Council's power to adopt tribal budgets is subject to review by the
7 Secretary of the Interior and by some oversight Resolution No. 47-77
8 adopting such carryover budget was not submitted to the Secretary for the
9 required approval; and

10 WHEREAS, the Papago Council is in the process of developing the 1978 budget and,
11 since it may not be able to complete such budget until December 1, it
12 will be necessary to adopt an interim budget to cover the 60-day period
13 between October 1, and December 1, 1977; and

14 WHEREAS, the Papago Council did on July 22, 1977, by Resolution 61-77, amend
15 General Counsel Contract HB 50C1420 with the firm of Strickland and
16 Altaffer to increase the maximum fee and expense limitations for the
17 fiscal year 1977 to \$122,500 and \$10,000 respectively; and on September
18 15, 1977, by Resolution No. 73-77, did authorize execution of new General
19 Council Contract with said law firm setting similar increased maximum
20 fee and expense limitations to be effective starting September 25, 1977,
21 which maximum fee and expense limitations exceed those set in the 1977
22 budget.

23 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY the Papago Council that it does hereby ratify
24 and confirm its Resolution No. 47-77, and effective June 3, 1977, the date
25 of said Resolution, does hereby, numc pro tenc:

- 26 1) Adopt a fiscal year for the Papago Tribe which shall run from October
27 1 through September 30 of each year, starting October 1, 1977;
- 28 2) Adopt a carryover budget or budgets for the unbudgeted quarter between
29 July 1, 1977 and September 30, 1977, of (a) 25% of existing annual
30 budget, not including costs for capital equipment, plus (b) the unused
31 portions of such budgets for capital equipment.

1 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Papago Council does hereby adopt an interim 1978
2 budget for the period of October 1 to December 1, 1977, of (a) one-sixth
3 (1/6) of the 1977 annual budget, not including cost for capital equipment,
4 plus (b) any unused portions of such budget for capital equipment.

5 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the aforementioned carryover budget for the period
6 of July 1, 1977 through September 30, 1977, and interim budget for the
7 period of October 1, 1977 through December 1, 1977, are hereby amended
8 to reflect the increased maximum fee and expenses limitations set for
9 the law firm of Strickland and Altaffer in the General Counsel
10 Contracts amended or authorized by Resolution 61-77 and 73-77.

11 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 10th day
12 of October, 1977, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of
13 1065.0 for; 0 against; 0 not voting; and 0 absent, pursuant to authority vested
14 in the Council by Section 3(a) and (h) of Article V of the Constitution and By-
15 laws of the Papago Tribe as amended, ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12,
16 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant
17 to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984) Said Resolution is
18 effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago
19 Agency is subject to review by the Secretary of Interior.
