

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL

RES. NO. 9-77

1 WHEREAS, the El Paso Natural Gas Company (El Paso) was granted a  
2 right-of-way 20 feet in width for the construction, operation  
3 and maintenance of an 8 5/8-inch pipeline for the transpor-  
4 tation of natural gas for domestic and industrial uses in  
5 Ajo across 52.7 miles (31.2 miles within the Sif Oidak Dis-  
6 trict, and 21.5 miles within the Hickiwan District) of the  
7 Papago Reservation, which right-of-way expires on June 12,  
8 1977; and

9 WHEREAS, El Paso has requested a renewal of such right-of-way for a  
10 period of 20 years and has submitted such request directly  
11 to the Sif Oidak and Hickiwan District Councils; and


12 WHEREAS, the Sif Oidak and Hickiwan District Councils did by separate  
13 Resolutions (attached) approve the renewal of such right-of-  
14 way upon certain minimum criteria, and did request that the  
15 Papago Council appoint the Papago Tribal Utility Authority  
16 to negotiate the renewal or grant of such right-of-way to  
17 El Paso.

18 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that the Papago  
19 Tribal Utility Authority is hereby authorized and directed  
20 to negotiate the renewal or grant of a right-of-way to El  
21 Paso Natural Gas Company upon such terms and conditions as  
22 will meet the minimum criteria set by the Councils of the  
23 Sif Oidak and Hickiwan Districts and will constitute fair  
24 compensation for the renewal or grant of such right-of-way.

25 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on  
26 the 4th day of February, 1977, at a meeting at which a quorum was  
27 present with a vote of 834.0 for; 0 against; 0 not voting; and 2  
28 absent; pursuant to the authority vested in the Council by Section 2  
29 (a) (c) and (e) of Article V of the Constitution and By-laws of the  
30 Papago Tribe as amended, ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12,  
31 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6,  
32 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat.984).

1 Said Resolution is not subject to review by the Secretary of the  
2 Interior and is effective as of the date of its enactment by the  
3 Papago Council
