

Resolution Authorizing Papago Construction Company to
Seek Funding For Improvements

RESOLUTION 10-79

1 WHEREAS, the Papago Tribal Council at its January 26, 1979 meeting, was made
2 aware of the problems faced by Papago Construction Company in its
3 efforts to provide employment to the Papago people by soliciting for
4 construction jobs on the reservation.

5 These problems relate to management, lack of equipment, and lack of
6 advanced training.

7 WHEREAS, these problems have not been dealt with in the past and

8 WHEREAS, the Papago Construction Company is owned and operated by the Papago
9 Tribe, and


10 WHEREAS, Papago Construction Company with the Tribal Administration have begun
11 to seek funding in an effort to resolve these problems and issues.

12 NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT the Papago Tribal Council hereby supports the
13 efforts of the Papago Construction Company and the Tribal Administration
14 to seek funding for making the necessary improvements for Papago
15 Construction to become economically self-sustaining.

16 The Papago Tribal Council also requests that any funding received by
17 the Papago Construction Company for these efforts be open and made a
18 part of the record for review by the Tribal Council. This includes the
19 budget, the expenditures and the term of the grant period.

20 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 26th day
21 of January, 1979, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of
22 1065 for; 0 against; 0 not voting; and 0 absent, pursuant
23 to authority vested in the Papago Council by Sections 2 (a) & (f) of Article V
24 of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe as amended, ratified by the
25 Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior
26 on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat.
27 984). Said Resolution is not subject to review by the Secretary of Interior and
28 is effective as of the date of its enactment by the Papago Council.
