

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO COUNCIL
(Power and Duties of the Law & Order Committee)

RES. NO. 16-79

1 WHEREAS, the Papago Tribe has an obligation to provide for the
2 maintenance of Law and Order and the Administration of
3 Justice for its people; and

4 WHEREAS, the Papago Council has authority to appoint subordinate
5 boards and committees and to prescribe their duties and
6 powers; and

7 WHEREAS, the Papago Council on _____ 1977 did appoint
8 members to form the Law and Order Committee to provide
9 for the Administration of Justice and the maintenance
10 of Law and Order, but failed to prescribe the duties and
11 powers of the Law and Order Committee;

12 THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Law and Order Committee is
13 hereby authorized:

- 14 (a) to adopt, amend and formulate rules, regulations and
15 guidelines necessary to carry out its business;
- 16 (b) to assist the Judicial and Law Enforcement Depart-
17 ments in the development of laws, rules, criteria,
18 standards and procedures for effective Administration
19 of Justice on the Papago Reservation;
- 20 (c) to develop and improve the quality of Law and Order
21 on the Papago Reservation by supporting and assist-
22 ing in the implementation of innovative tribal
23 justice programs;
- 24 (d) to interview and recommend to the Papago Council any
25 person qualified to work in a position with the
26 Judicial or Law Enforcement Department;
- 27 (e) to recommend and advise the Papago Council of all
28 matters relating to the operation of the Judicial or
29 Law Enforcement Departments.

1 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council
2 on the 13th day of February, 1979, at a meeting at which a
3 quorum was present, with a vote of 1047.5 for; 0 against;
4 17.5 not voting; and 1 absent, pursuant to the authority
5 vested in the Council by Section 3(a)(h) of Article V of the
6 Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe as amended, ratified
7 by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the
8 Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section
9 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution
10 is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent
11 of the Papago Agency and is subject to review by the Secretary
12 of Interior.
