15		until it can be determined whether the Tribe can anticipate the

17	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that it does hereby adopt							
18		a second quarter F.Y. 1979 interim budget for the period of January						
19		1, 1979, to April 1, 1979, consisting of (a) one-quarter (1/4) of the						
20	F.Y. 1978 budget, not including costs for capital equipment, plus							
21		(b) any unused portions of such budget for capital equipment.
