3		of Tribal Governments"; and							
4	WHEREAS,	the Bureau of Indian Affairs has allocated \$304,800 of							
5		FY-79 funds for such grant purposes at the Papago							
6		Reservation; and							
7	WHEREAS,	the Papago Tribe does have need to strengthen and develop							
8		its Tribal government and management.							
9	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Papago Council does request								
10		the Bureau of Indian Affairs to grant funds to the Papago							
11	Tribe in the amount of at least \$304,800.								
12	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that such funds shall be used for the								
13	development and improvement of Tribal government according								
14	to the budget and work program herein attached.								
15	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Mr. Cecil Williams, Chairman, Mr. Max								
16	H. Norris, Vice Chairman, or Mr. Vincent Crawford, Treasurer								
17	Treasurer are hereby authorized to negotiate and sign								
18	whatever grant documents are required and, further, to								
19	negotiate and sign ammendments and extensions to such								
20	grant.								
21	The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on								
22	the 29th day of March, 1979, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 1065 for, 0 against, 0 not voting;								
23	and 2 absent, pursuant to authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (d) of Article V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona as amended, ratifies by the Papago								
24	Tribe on December 12, 1936 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of								
25	June 18,	1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is not subject to the Secretary of the Interior and is effective as of the							
26	date of i	ts enactment by the Papago Council
